## **Wayne County Opioid Overdose and Bloodborne Infection Resources**

Several sources of information were not utilized in the *Missouri Opioid Overdose and Bloodborne Infection Vulnerability Assessments - 2020*. This was primarily due to lack of information available for every county or difficulty incorporating the information into the methodology. However, this information could still be of value for identifying the resources available and challenges the community faces, as well as determining what next steps should be taken.
