AWARD INFORMATION

Incorporation: In addition to the federal laws, regulations, policies, and CDC General Terms and Conditions for Non-research awards at <https://www.cdc.gov/grants/federal-regulations-policies/index.html>, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) hereby incorporates Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS): Impact in Population Health CDC-RFA-DP20-2007, and application dated March 10, 2022, as may be amended, which are hereby made a part of this Non-research award, hereinafter referred to as the Notice of Award (NoA).

Approved Funding: Funding in the amount of \$546,000 is approved for the Year 3 budget period, which is August 1, 2022 through July 31, 2023. All future year funding will be based on satisfactory programmatic progress and the availability of funds.

The federal award amount is subject to adjustment based on total allowable costs incurred and/or the value of any third party in-kind contribution when applicable.

Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Funds and Availability: COVID-19 funding in the amount of \$11,479 is approved for this award for budget period 08/01/2022 through 07/31/2023.

Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) FFR Reporting: The recipient is required to report separately on the use of COVID-19 funds on the Federal Financial Report (FFR). Financial Assistance Mechanism: Cooperative Agreement

Substantial Involvement by CDC: This is a cooperative agreement and CDC will have substantial programmatic involvement after the award is made. Substantial involvement is in addition to all post-award monitoring, technical assistance, and performance reviews undertaken in the normal course of stewardship of federal funds.

CDC program staff will assist, coordinate, or participate in carrying out effort under the award, and recipients agree to the responsibilities therein, as detailed in the NOFO.

Technical assistance will be provided in the form of regular one-on-one monthly conference calls, a monthly all funded recipient conference call, Data collector's technical conference calls, in person and remote (webinar) trainings and presentations, Conferences, Annual questionnaire meetings, and on site and reverse site visits. This support will allow CDC to:

- Providing resources, training, technical assistance, and consultation to develop, maintain and enhance monitoring and surveillance systems.
- Providing resources, training, and technical assistance, and consultation to support and facilitate collection and use of data.
- Maintaining electronic mechanisms for information sharing, program planning, and progress reporting.
- Maintaining Web sites that provide links to databases (such as the State Activities Tracking and Evaluation System and BRFSS) that contain state-specific information and comparable measures that are critical to chronic disease prevention and health promotion activities.
- Serving as a convener and resource for the continued expansion of the science base of chronic disease prevention and health promotion programs.

Budget Revision Requirement: By September 1, 2022 the recipient must submit a revised budget with a narrative justification and workplan based on the approved funding amount of \$546,000. Failure to submit the required information in a timely manner may adversely affect the future funding of this project. If the information cannot be provided by the due date, you are required to contact the GMS/GMO identified in the CDC Staff Contacts section of this notice before the due date.

Expanded Authority: The recipient is permitted the following expanded authority in the administration of the award.

- Carryover of unobligated balances from one budget period to a subsequent budget period. Unobligated funds may be used for purposes within the scope of the project as originally approved. Recipients will report use, or intended use, of unobligated funds in Section 12 "Remarks" of the annual Federal Financial Report. If the GMO determines that some or all of the unobligated funds are not necessary to complete the project, the GMO may restrict the recipient's authority to automatically carry over unobligated balances in the future, use the balance to reduce or offset CDC funding for a subsequent budget period, or use a combination of these actions.

FUNDING RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS

Indirect Costs: Indirect costs are approved based on the negotiated indirect cost rate agreement dated March 30, 2021, which calculates indirect costs as follows, a Provisional is approved at a rate of 19.00% of the base, which includes, direct salaries and wages including all fringe benefits. The effective dates of this indirect cost rate are from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2024.
