

Public Health Focus Areas: Five Core Public Health Functions

**Communicable Disease Prevention:** Prevents the spread of all communicable diseases including influenza, Tuberculosis, Sexually Transmitted Diseases and HIV; Conducts disease surveillance and outbreak investigations; Administers the Ryan White Title I AIDS Services Grant; and Oversees HIV/AIDS counseling the testing efforts. **Environmental Health Services:** Air Pollution Control; Animal Regulation; Child Care Safety and Licensure; Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (screening, case management and educational outreach); Community Sanitation; Food and Beverage Control; and Vector Control. **Health Promotion Disease Prevention:** Chronic Disease; Maternal and Child Health; Nutrition and Obesity Initiative, Show Me Heathly Women, and School Health Services. **Public Health Infrastructure and Systems:** Computer Training Lab; Data Analysis; Database Development; Epidemiology; GIS Mapping; Maintain Health Alert Network; Primary and Secondary Data; Research; Satellite Broadcasts; and Web Site Development. **The Office of Emergency Response and Terrorism:** Prepares plans; Conducts exercises; and Trains staff for the public health response to all public health emergencies (natural, accidental, or intentional).
