Center for Patient Safety Lee Varner	Shelby Cox reporting. CPS has been busy with collaboration with ESO and also with Kansas MARCER. CPS data shows 28 patient deaths caused by EMS since 2011.  EMS Culture of Safety efforts going well.  Every problem identified in the survey is related to problems with information exchange CPS preparing a 4-hr pre-con for Pinnacle Conf in July. Shelby said some big announcements coming out soon.
