The EMSC committee is being reactivated. Many of the EMS issues have been rolled into one bill SB 870. The issues area also reflected in HB1919. Interstate Compact, CIT, TIF, State medical director etc. So far there is little opposition. The 911 bill is also moving although work needs to continue to avoid a filibuster as in previous years.  Mark and Jason also reported attending a meeting with the Director of DHSS, Dr. Williams, to discuss the TCD system in Missouri. MHA, AHA and others were also present. The TCD system is funded for one more year but a long-range plan needs to be developed.  Regulations rewrite continues. Medical Directors, patient hand off and EMS Advisory Committee regional boundaries under discussion.  Chuck Doss has tasked the Education Subcommittee to review all regulations affecting education and to participate in the regulations rewrite efforts.
