	Examples are age distribution, primary vs secondary		
	transfers, zip codes of fatalities, preventable causes of death.		
	One reason that MO has incomplete data is because some		
	hospitals have national accreditation and can't access image		
	trends. Trauma needs funding to have accessible statewide		
	data.		
	Many institutions have no idea MOSTORM exists or what it		<u>N</u>
	is for.		
	Terry Ellsworth recognized there is a disconnect in getting		
	data when the hospital is designated by other than the state.		
	However, Terry can designate a person to have access to the		
	bridge to Image Trends.		
	HDE is a portal that allows information flow between		
	hospital and EMS, controlled by hospital.		
	Leeann Johnson asked is there one repository for data to be		
	stored for access by receiving hospital. Terry said that is the		
	goal.
