The meeting was called to order at approximately 12:31 pm by Chair Dr. Lynthia Andrews Bowman. A quorum was in attendance.

	Pandemic Update: Only small changes in visitor allowances. Numbers are down for all hospitals.  EMSC Update- Liz, Dani and Stephen Dunkin all reported on their engagement with EMS systems and updates on the EMSC State Quality Improvement Subcommittee.  EMS readiness survey ends at the end of March.	
	2022 Planning- How can the pediatric subcommittee make the largest impact with new data collection capabilities and best support EMSC efforts: Struggle still exists in gathering state data for quality measures. Discussion was held regarding the validity of using a PEW or PAT score as a mandated field such as GSC, all agreed more research into those scores was needed.	

2022 NASEMSO Guidelines were scheduled for release the first month of March, but we are still waiting on them. Discussion was held regarding the wide variation in pediatric protocols that still exist in our state and how we can best address them. Airway control was discussed along with best practices. A letter was released from Cardinal Glennon endorsing the use of cuffed endotracheal tubes and supraglottic airway adjuncts. Engaging the regional medical directors was declared the best way to address variation and possible deviation from best practices in outdated protocols. Pediatric DNR Regulation – House Bill 2741 has been officially filed and is being sponsored by Representative Bill Kidd Missouri House of Representatives - Bill Information for HB2741 (mo.gov) \*The Ped SAC will not be meeting in March. Introductions There were no new members on the meeting. II. Trauma Regulation Update There will be no change to the trauma regulations until the TCD statute is voted through. III. Trauma Statute update Pam reported that the TCD House Bill was voted unanimously in the subcommittee to move forward for a vote in the House of Representatives. It has not been voted on in the House yet. IV. Data Nicolle was not available for a data update. There were questions brought up about the data mapping issue into Image Trend. It was reported that a couple people have worked with DI/ESO about the issue and was trying to meet with Peggy Huddleston and Nicolle Gamm about it, but no meeting has happened yet. V. SAC Pediatric Subcommittee Report Josh Dugall reported that the EMS-C group is continuing their focus working on supplies and equipment. They have hired a new person, Steven Duncan, to do EMS education. He

will be traveling throughout the state. They have a QI committee working to pull data for pediatrics, but are working through some mapping issues and trying to improve that reporting. There was discussion on EMS protocols in the state and hoping for a release of new national guidelines coming out this month for 2022 with new evidence-based practice recommendations. Hoping the state EMS Medical Group will support them. Cardinal Glennon has put out a letter talking about internal work that has been done to help with failed intubations in children. They have switched to cuffed intubation tubes except in smaller sizes. Pam asked about the ACS requesting new pediatric readiness guidelines. Josh said his committee hasn't discussed it, but they could. He said that if your hospital is up to the EMS-C guidelines then you would meet the ACS guidelines.

## VI. Trauma Education

- a. 2022 Midwest Pediatric Trauma Conference will be June 10<sup>th</sup>. The cost is \$50 for in person, which includes lunch. \$40 for the virtual option.
- b. Steven R Hall Trauma Symposium will be October 3-4-5, 2022. It will be in person at Big Cedar Lodge.
- c. There will be a TNCC Instructor course being held this week and there will be another TNCC Instructor course August 30, 2022 in Kansas City.
- d. There will be a PTAC class put on at the TraumaCon conference it focuses on trauma care after the initial resuscitation.
