Education Subcommittee Chuck Doss, Chair	National Registry resolution 22-13 would eliminate the current requirement of paramedics graduating from an accredited school in order to take the NR cognitive test as a step towards licensure. Comment period ends mid August. Discussion included:  There is a history of elevating paramedic education by requiring accreditation of programs EMS for the Future included accreditation in its discussion  Jason White said the process is concerning. Usually don't have hot topics come up in the summer vacation month. Some think it is a real step backwards.  Question of the impact on the Interstate Compact efforts.  Chuck Doss said CoA (accrediting group) has become cumbersome—NR resolution may be a reflection of that frustration.  Jason White said a number of people were reflecting CoA has become clunky and bureaucratic.  Dr. Froelke said NASEMSO met the week after the NR resolution was released. The word betrayal was used to describe how NASEMSO members felt when it was apparent, they had not been consulted before the resolution was released.  There was a question if this could have a political motivation.  Also, why does CoA have the market cornered on accrediting the schools.  Jason White indicated MARCER, Region A (aka West Central) will be considering responses to NREMT.

Air Ambulance Subcommittee Ruby Mehrer, Chair	The air ambulance subcommittee met this morning. The response to the Amtrak Train wreck in Mendon MO June 27 <sup>th</sup> was discussed. 16 air ambulances were requested to respond. Not all of them landed at the scene and some that did land, did not take a patient. However, the response was coordinated and smooth. Several patients were transported by air.	
	Air Ambulance Utilization document reviewed by the Regional Medical Directors Subcommittee and accepted.	

	One suggestion was to add the time/distance graphic that was in the NAEMSP article that framed the utilization	
	piece. The graphic identified when it became useful to alert an air ambulance based on distance and time. The	
	air ambulance subcommittee wanted to review the graphic and will respond after their next meeting.	
	No response from the 911 group on Air Amb resolution regarding inaccurate ETE to scene flights.	
	MOAAMS (Missouri Association of Air Medical Services ) has awarded 6 scholarships for the MO EMS Conf & Expo. The scholarships pay for the conference registration and the hotel stay.

Emergency Management Helen Sandkuhl, Chair	Helen Sandkuhl said the Emergency Management Subcommittee met virtually yesterday. They are engaging with several agencies in the state including, ENA, EMSC and MHA. Several of those representatives sit on the committee.	
	The recent statewide Burn Surge exercise was discussed. Burn triage was brought up as future education for EMS and hospitals.	
	Helen has applied for a committee grant from MO Foundation for Health to assist with rural disaster preparedness education. She has been contacted by MHA and is awaiting more communication. Ways to house the grant money is being explored.	
	Helen was the duty officer for her STARRS area's disaster response to the Mendon MO train wreck. She and others SMOC duty officers worked with Kari Barclay, MHA, and other coalition members throughout the state to provide potential assistance and to determine patient's destinations and outcome.	
	This subcommittee may do a review of the event and then report at the next SAC meeting in September. Plans to provide a COVID-19 and Monkeypox Update in September to assist in keeping EMS Personnel Safe.

	Dr. Carney discussed the Amtrak wreck yesterday. She became aware of the event when 3 KCFD off duty personnel called her. They were on the train. Discussion included some of the drawbacks of the wreck being in such a remote area. Initial size up and initial response requests not well coordinated. Regardless of limitations, all critical patients were off the scene within one hour. Patient tracking has been a problem in this event as it was after the Joplin tornado. Improvements were made after Joplin. SEMA helpful after that event.  Dr. Carney expressed her thanks to all who were involved. As reviews are completed about the event, hopefully there will be a better way to rapidly notify key players in the state, including the State EMS Medical Director.  Next meeting will include further discussion on the Medical Directors' reg as well as CoA and NREMT. Also 988 discussion.

	The TCD Annual Report is finished and available online.  A group is being formed to look at diversion across the state. A standardized approach is a goal. Several of the current group would like to be involved including Dr. Carney, Justin Duncan and Dr. Andrews.
