	 I. Introductions Sharell Questelle has been the Interim Trauma Program Manager at Mercy Health Joplin. Kaitlin Doll has just accepted that position. Kaitlin's email is kaitlin.doll@mercy.net. II. Trauma Statute Update The TCD statute has not been voted on in the House yet but has had all of the reads. 	
	III. Trauma Regulation update Jami Blackwell reported there was a TCD meeting with Nicole, Michelle, Dr. Coughenour, and Jami and plan to look at the new Gray Book and cross reference that to the Trauma Regulations before they move forward.	

IV. Update from the State

Nicolle reminded everyone that 4th quarter data is due March 31st. She reminded all to contact the Dept early if in need of password resets or having issues to download. Image Trend will not reset passwords and the office closes at 5 PM. Contact Peggy Huddleston for assistance.

There is one facility that is missing quarter 3 data, but it is believed to be a vendor issue. The timeliness and completeness of downloads are reviewed by the state. The TCD office received a copy of the Gray Book yesterday and Nicole said there were 387 standards in the previous version, and they are reduced to 110. She said she did not see any Level IV in the new standards and said the alternate pathway will need to be changed. She plans to work with Jami to make the regulation changes. She said there have been 2 virtual trauma surveys and they both went well and received good feedback from the reviewers and the facilities. She said nothing has changed except for the platform. She plans those virtual surveys will happen thru 2022 and will have to re-evaluate after that. She said currently there are about 135 TCD surveys backlogged from 2020 and 2021. They are doing 2-3 surveys a week. If you are interested in being a surveyor with the state reach out to Nicole Gamm. She encouraged everyone to reach out to her or Michelle if there are any questions. The TCD website is under construction. Trauma, Stroke, and STEMI are divided out to their own page. Plan to have the regulations, application, FAQs, information about surveys, etc. on the site. A question was asked about the reporting year if the survey was rescheduled. Nicole said the dates will probably be adjusted closer to the date of survey.

East Central Mark Flauter, Chair	Next EC meeting is April 8 th . Awards dinner is in planning Stroke protocol was reviewed. Helen Sandkuhl said there is one opening on the EC Regional EMS Committee.	
West Central (Reg A)	Dr. Gustafson said WC or Reg A met Mar 7.	
Dr. David Gustafson	Issues with TCD diversion and interfacility transfers were discussed. In January there were ambulances circling KC trying to find hospitals that were open. It was especially difficult finding a place for stroke patients. Family became upset. sometimes the delay was up to 45 minutes. Currently it is not much of an issue, but Dr. Gustafson is confident it will happen again at some point. It was noted that our health care system is not structured to handle surges. NW transfer and transport guide was provided to Dr G from Art Maxwell, NW region. It addresses 'what does the patient need' as its core question. Next meeting will be in July –probably the 11 ^{th.}	
	Helen Sandkuhl shared that 6-7 years ago EC had similar things happening with hospital closures. An oversight commission with MHA addressed the need to stop the patients from having STEMI and passing hospitals. The hospitals agreed they had to own their business—hospitals have triggers such as no beds, no staff, no doc, no equip etc. Used the tool to decide when they need help and how to solve the problem(s). The hospitals recognized they owned the problems and they needed to step up to the plate to manage them. Changes included management coming in at night, bonuses offered and NEDOCS was used same system being tried in KC.	
	Dr. Andrews asked about surge and if EMResource will help. Sarah Willson from MHA said emergency department volume has been very high for several month. Mix of patients has been changing recently –more behavioral/mental health pts. One question being explored is 'should some of the patients be cared for otherwise in the community?' MHA is exploring various things to try to improve emergency departments when	

	experiencing high volume. MHA will do some evaluations to try to figure what system and policy changes are needed. EMResource monitors diversions. Looking at the whole state to determine vulnerabilities. Data from EMResource is being examined. The overall message is that surges will happen again. Healthcare landscape has changed, delivery of health care changed, and improvements will be pursued. Dr. Andrews noted in the NW Region, monoclonal antibodies have been made available in different areas.	
BEMS Taz Meyer, Chief	Taz said BEMS offers licensing online including for training agencies. BEMS is working on a user guide. BEMS needs 5-6 days to process license request if there is no criminal history. More time is needed if there is a complicated background check.	
Interstate Compact Taz Meyer, BEMS Chief	Tax said there is not a lot of activity to report right now. The next meeting is Thursday March 24 th . Work continues on the data base.	
TCD Task Force Steve Bollin, DHSS	Nicole Gamm announced the new DHSS Director is Paula Nicholson. State TCD Task Force met again last week. Annual Report will be out to review in April. Goals include: TCD Diversion, Collaboration with other agencies and resources. Also reducing hospital variances. Trying to include rehab to complete the circle	
	Peggy Huddleston said she works on TCD and other projects including the NEMSIS data. She reminded those using the sunshine request to get data reports that there is not yet a whole year of data. Since 2019, 2.1 million ePCRs have been entered. She also said 38 long term facilities have closed.	
	Michelle Harbert said a vote on the thrombectomy capable centers is needed. The question will need to be addressed by SAC.	
	Steve Bolin arrived at 1:56 pm announcing he was happy to be here in person. He said the TCD Annual report was nearly finished. It will address what is TCD and where is it going. The focuses are on who are the partners, where are the facilities, etc. He has hospitals identified but wants to review EMS regions to show gaps, if any. Standing on shoulder of giants is part of the theme. This is the start of what we are going to do. Great staff. He encouraged everyone to ask questions of the group, look at the annual report and provide input on what is good and what was missed, etc.	
	Dr. Andrews added that SAC has been in existence since 1991. Many projects have been undertaken. Now TCD Task Force is trying to educate with the Annual report. It includes many success stories of patients. It is	

	important to step out and show what has been accomplished. Program too important to let it go. EMS and hospitals have embraced it and pushed it forward. The Annual Report will bring recognition to TCD work and its importance. It was a big project going in but if we have positive outcomes, we have quantity and also quality of life given back to the citizens of Missouri. People will continue to be productive citizens, working and living life to its fullest.

CARES, Kayla Riel	Kayla reported the new CARES advisory council has been formed, bylaws are finished. There are plans to add two non-voting members, including one from an EMS Assoc and MHA. Meetings will be quarterly. Also looking to fill a voting position—someone in cardiac program preferably. 2021 had 36 participating agencies—now there are 51 agencies. State of the Heart event, Oct 7. Highlights will be Cares Data—TCD, Peds, Survivors. Event will be a fund raising one. Mark Alexander asked if CARES was still looking for funding? Kayla said yes. The Registry fee for CARES is \$21,000 a year. Grants are being sought. Right now, MU pays the salaries. Kayla added that the Advisory Council will become more useful as data gathered. Research Project, AED and CARES CPR will be included.
