Legislative Subcommittee Mark Alexander, Chair	Mark Alexander reported the Legislative Subcommittee met this morning and discussed concerns with the Medical Directors regulations. These concerns were also brought up during the Regional Medical Directors Subcommittee meeting yesterday and included questions about the required class/training for the medical directors. The Medical Directors requested another month to consider options. NAEMSP has an 8-hour course that may be the answer. More information and discussion are needed. An update will be given next month.  Training Regulation wording was discussed. The goal is modernization to new nomenclature so the regulation language will match updates on national level. A legislative fix is planned for next year.	

	Community Paramedic discussion included rethinking if college credit and licensure is the best course or if a certification would be more efficient and meet requirements.

	Chuck also reported that NAEMSE has a video out that addresses entry into paramedic level education without having EMT as a prerequisite.	
	Fast Track bill that included Paramedic and EMT training passed this year. There are certain requirements that must be met to qualify for financial assistance for Paramedic and EMT students. The financial aid is a loan but converts to a grant if certain parameters are met. The program applies not only to colleges but also to Training Entities in Missouri.

Local grants for MIH have been established. On a national level, money is being earmarked by HRSA and CDC for MIH programs. An alliance is being formed with Missouri Rural Health Association.
