Legislative Subcommittee Mark Alexander, Chair	 Jason White reported on the EMS legislation being considered this year. The session ended Friday, May 12th. PTSD bills passed, one establishes a fund. The other has it as a workers comp. Police Union in KC had leadership on these bills. DNR passed with language addressing pediatric DNR, TPOPP and some out of state DNRs. Nomenclature bill is on 3 pieces of legislation now on the governor's desk—also has language that NREMT determines what accreditation is required for EMT and Paramedic initial education. EMD oversight has been shifted to DHSS. That provides a better medical oversight. Telecommunicators now included in the definition of first responder—that will make them eligible for LODD and other benefits provided to first responders. Six communities moved to public safety sales tax. ARPA funding passed again. \$30 million allotted but not sure yet of the rules and the cap on the grants. Local match amount not clear yet. Peer Review did not pass. Trial attorneys are always against this issue. ½ to 1% sales tax increase failed this year. Three years ago the issue passed but the Governor vetoed a bill the tax increase was attached to. New Business and Announcements	Dr. Andrews acknowledged a letter signed by several organizations and sent to DHSS earlier this month. The letter addressed problems perceived in the TCD hospital survey process. Dr. Andrews said SAC's focus is on the patients in our state and how best to serve them. Rural hospitals have an important part to play in the TCD system. Having quick access and appropriate initial treatment leads to better outcomes. When hospitals close down, there are many ripple effects including longer transport times for patients and less EMS coverage for citizens when ambulances from their district are traveling long distances to get patients to initial hospital care. Dr. Andrews said SAC will continue to serve as a resource and is interested not only in getting patients the care they need as rapidly as possible but also to help address problems including lack of reimbursement for EMS.
