Emergency Management	Emergency Preparedness Committee Minutes — provided by Helen Sandkuhl	
Helen Sandkuhl, Chair	Concern was discussed over Missouri state readiness for potential influx of Ebola patients. The Missouri State Ebola Plan was last evaluated in 2020. After discussion, Dr. Andrews and the Emergency Preparedness Chairperson requested that the SAC Board members review the plan and that any clarifications, comments or concerns would be collected and shared with MHA and DHSS for resolution and EMS education. In addition, John Whitaker from DHSS also shared the plan with Taz Meyer from the Bureau of EMS for his awareness of what our committee was doing. We contacted Jackie Gatz from MHA and she was thankful for our inquiry and was going to include her team for awareness. The following are some concerns after review of the plan:	
	 A handful of EMS agencies around the state had agreed to transport/transfer patients to assessment hospitals but we have not updated or made changes to the EMS partners or procedures in the plan. Need to review page 54 of the plan for accuracy. Are all stakeholders still willing to participate in the plan. Are all stakeholders still in business? All agreements need to be renewed as soon as possible. Institutions may be the same but leadership may be different. Need to get renewed commitment. 	
	 Does transport routes make sense? Example: transporting a patient from SW Missouri to STL when they are finally going to Nebraska? Is there a contract with the University of Kansas ?We need to make sure that the assessment hospitals have not changed or if we have gained hospitals that may be closer and make better sense for the patient and staff to transport to. We feel that the above concerns need to be discussed and addressed in a timely fashion in order for us to 	

	be able to communicate changes to all parties so everyone can be prepared in case we do see an influx of Ebola patients. We would like to thank everyone for their time and consideration in this project.

The Arizona model indicated having control over hypoxia, hypotension and hyperventilation improved TBI patient outcomes.
