	collaborative. The 3 rd party is invoiced and the hospitals pay that collaborative party. There is a fee of \$5,000 if
	there are 3-5 hospitals participating. If 6-10 participating hospitals it is \$10,000, 11-24 is \$15,000, and 25 and
